



Sub-transmission Cost Sharing Scheme

At Powercor, we are proud to support the connection of large-scale projects such as renewables, battery energy storage systems, data centres, mines and other large customers into our network.

Many of these large connections are best suited to connect to our sub-transmission system, which offers greater flexibility and capacity.

We understand that connection costs can be significant, and these are an important factor when planning your project. In some cases, new or upgraded sub-transmission assets may only be partially used by the first customer, leaving extra capacity available for others to connect in the future.

While this shared use is a smart way to make the most of our network, it can mean that the first customer pays more than those who connect later.

To address this Powercor has introduced a Sub-Transmission Cost Sharing Scheme (SCSS) which aims to:

- Make it easier for customers to connect to the sub-transmission network by offering rebates to the first customer
- Ensure costs are shared more equitably among large industrial customers

How the SCSS works

If you're the first customer to connect to a new or upgraded eligible sub-transmission line or station asset, you may be eligible for a cost-sharing rebate when subsequent customers connect to the same sub-transmission asset within five years.

Powercor will calculate the rebate for sub-transmission lines based on how much of the line's capacity and length the subsequent customer uses.

Powercor will calculate the rebate for sub-transmission station assets based on the proportion of total capacity that the subsequent customer uses.

We'll collect the appropriate amount from the new customer and pass it on to you.

If your sub-transmission line and/or station assets are eligible, we'll include the relevant details in your connection contract.
